How it all began... The 50-bed Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital (OTMH) was built 60 years ago on nine acres of land. It was originally designed to serve a community of less than 20,000 residents.

Over the years... OTMH has evolved to accommodate Oakville's growing population and changing healthcare practices and technology.

Today... OTMH is a busy acute-care community hospital, serving more than 176,000 people from the Oakville community and surrounding areas.

However... The hospital has reached the point where there is no longer room to expand on its current site. A new hospital is needed to meet the healthcare needs of the growing community and to accommodate the changing face of healthcare delivery.

Coming soon... A new hospital for Oakville. The Government of Ontario has approved the development of a new hospital on a 50-acre site at Third Line and Dundas Street.
